- The revised chapter on "Police and Justice" includes the recent recommendations of the Kefauver Crime Committee.
- Material has been included on new intergovernmental arrangements and to schemes for reconstruction and reform.
- Liberal use has been made of footnotes, referring, primarily to source materials which the author himself has found helpful.
