Help Keep a Citizenship Question Off the Census: Submit a Comment

ASA is working to ensure that a citizenship question is not included on the 2020 Census. The late addition of an untested question would fundamentally undermine the scientific integrity of the census, threatening the accuracy of the enumeration. You can help. The Census Bureau recently published a notice in the Federal Register seeking public comments on 2020 Census data collection. We encourage ASA members to <u>submit individual comments</u> regarding the citizenship question. Comments are due by August 7, 2018. Thank you for your efforts.
