Voting in the 2015 ASA election closes at 5:00 p.m. EDT on June 1. Eligible members may vote online using the login information in the e-mail notification sent from the election vendor. See the <u>full election slate</u> and <u>profiles of candidates for President, Vice President, and Secretary</u> and be sure to cast your ballot by 5:00 p.m. EDT on June 1.

- **Deadlines for Program participants.** All program participants (member and non-member) were to preregister by May 13, in order to retain their listings in the online and printed *Final Program*.
- Deadline for Program Changes. Any changes to session listings for the printed Final Program must be received by ASA Meeting Services (meetings@asanet.org) no later than June 1.

   Department Chair Conference, Director of Graduate Studies Conference, or the Social Media Conference. Preregister online by July 8.
  - This year's <u>Chairs Conference</u> will focus on "Sex and Gender in Sociology Departments: Policy and Management Issues in the Context of Intimate Relationships and Core Identities." This pre-meeting event offers a unique opportunity for sociology department leaders to talk with their counterparts in similar departments facing similar challenges, and a valued source of strategic insight and professional renewal.
  - Using a scenario-based approach, this year's <u>Directors of Graduate</u> <u>Studies Conference</u> will give participants the chance to collaborate with peers in thinking through ethical challenges that can arise in contexts such as advising, facilitating students' committees, and evaluating satisfactory academic progress. It will also examine the place of responsible conduct of research (RCR) and IRB training in the graduate curriculum.
  - The 2015 Annual Meeting will offer a special series of workshops aimed at increasing knowledge of social media and strategies for using these tools in sociological work. Nine training modules will be offered under the title, ASA <u>Social Media Pre-conference</u>, organized by Dustin Kidd (Temple University). Each workshop is offered at a charge of
