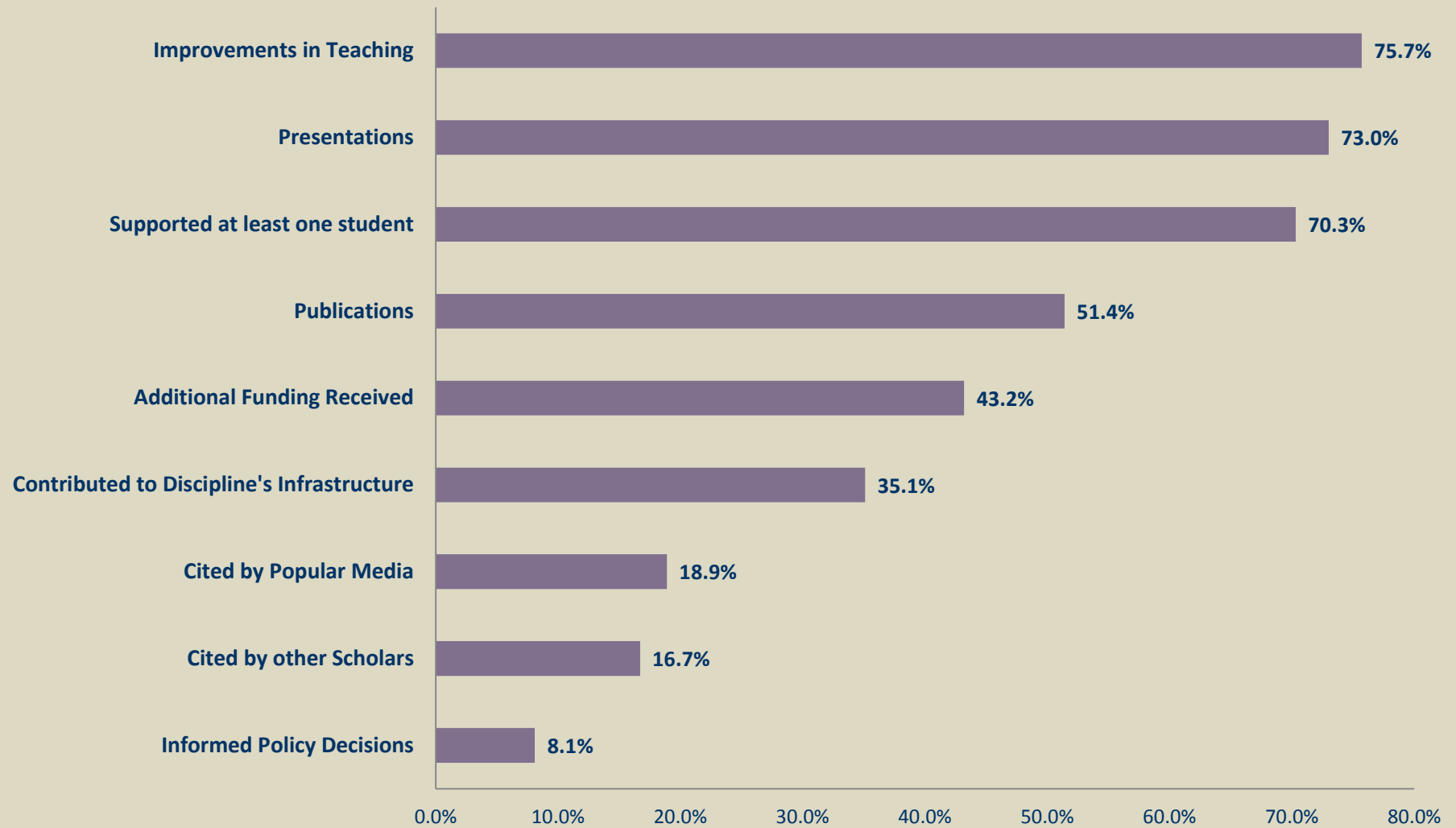

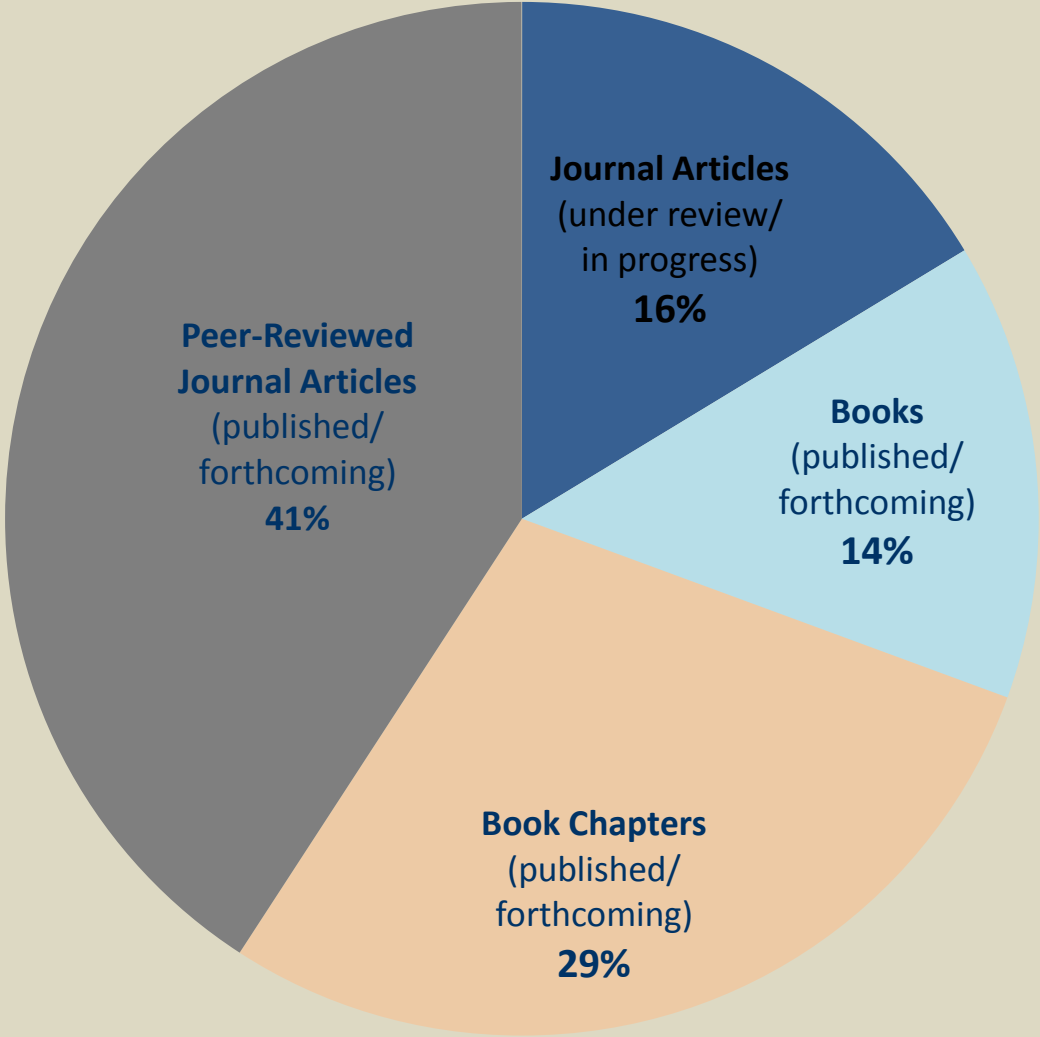
**Figure 1. Outcomes Reported by Responding FAD Awardees, December 2009-

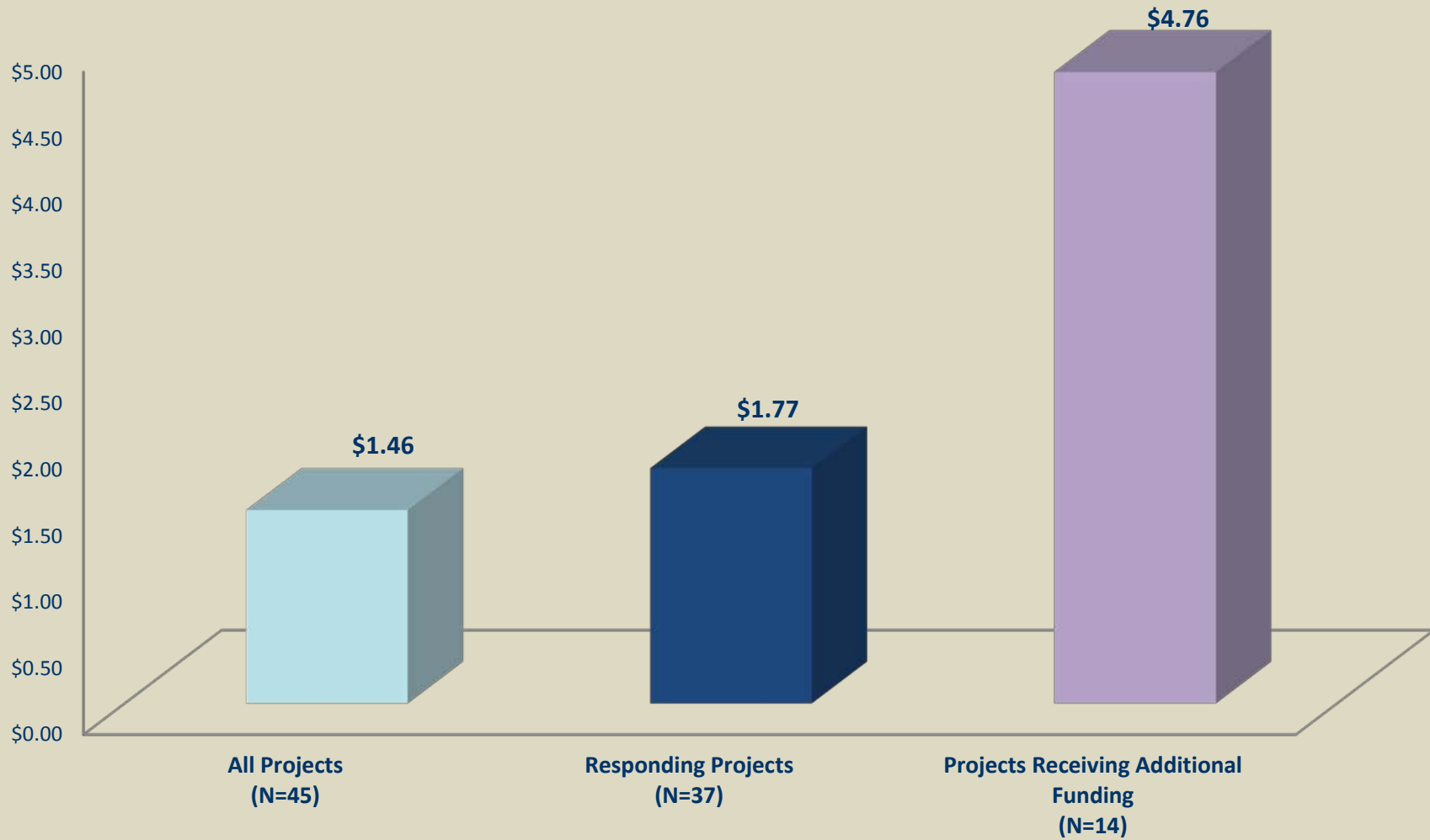
**Figure 2. Publications Reported by FAD Grantees, December 2009-
